






















































100+ Years of Adventure and many more to come

AAT Kings can be traced back to George Page's modest transport service from Melbourne to Brighton.

1930s

The Pike family introduced Sydney to Katoomba.

1960s

Bill King decided there was a real future with off-the-beaten-track journeys – Bill purchased two Land Rovers, an ex-army international ambulance and a Denning Bus and launched Bill King's Northern Safaris.

1970s

Bill designed and built his own 18 passenger vehicles and called them Desert Cruisers. AAT Coachlines had commenced operations in the Northern Territory.

1980s

AAT Coachlines purchased Bill King's Northern Safaris and operated as Bill King's Australian Adventure Tours.

1984

AAT Kings brand formed.

1997

AAT Kings joined The Travel Corporation Family of Brands.

1999

AAT Kings began operations in New Zealand.

2018

Churn things up on a dairy farm in Waikato

The Waikato countryside, 150 kilometres south of Auckland, is the stuff of postcards. It's particularly pretty at the Red Barn, a fully functioning dairy farm where you'll not only meet the gorgeous wide-eyed cows, but also try your hand at churning butter – then spread it thick on freshly baked bread before sitting down to a paddock-to-plate, country-style lunch.



The third island, and 400-strong community

Where brown kiwi birds outnumber humans, and where the rare yellow-eyed penguin waddles, Stewart Island is a haven for humans and animals alike. This pristine island is made up of 85 per cent national parkland. You'll discover this on a tour around the petite village, before travelling to its secluded bays, including a visit to Observation Rock, offering unbroken views over Paterson Inlet.



Surrounded by rolling countryside up on the hills of North Canterbury, you'll meet the Bamford Family, who have been farming premium Merino sheep since 1884. Wander the lanes following the smell of coffee (or local wines), before you dine at Postmasters Café, a historic cottage replete with picket fence and gardens, with snow-capped mountains in view.



Stories shared at Pounamu Pathway

Māwhera Pā is the ancestral home of Poutini Ngāi Tahu. Listen as you discover their stories in this immersive experience - tales of giants, warriors, trade, and treasure. Learn about pounamu and the significance of greenstone, a stone with a long history and a sacred material that holds 'mana' (spiritual power).



2 Auckland

A Rotorua – Auckland – Queenstown

Your visit to the National Kiwi Hatchery is guided by passionate conservationists and will give you fascinating insights into New Zealand's national bird on this rewarding **MAKE TRAVEL MATTER®** Experience. Once you've paused to admire the drama at Mirror Lakes, Knobs Flat, Hollyford Valley lookout and Cleddau Valley, you'll begin to understand why Rudyard Kipling called this the 'Eighth Wonder of the World'. You haven't even seen Bowen Falls or Milford Sound/Piopiotahi yet... Onboard your nature cruise, enjoy commentary from your eagle-eyed Naturalist guide, who not only narrates on the immense geological history of the Fjord, but will point out fur seals and dolphins should they choose to come out to play. The cruise includes a delicious picnic lunch. **B** L

6 Queenstown Free Time

Take today at your own pace. Like things fast and furious? Feel the wind in your hair on a high-octane jet boat ride, perhaps. Prefer to be able to talk (and drink wine) while you cruise? Glide across Lake Wakatipu aboard the historic TSS Earnslaw to Walter Peak High Country Farm for a guided farm tour, including morning or afternoon tea, in a stunning alpine setting (both own expense). Wherever you wander, be sure to save space for tonight's Highlight Dinner at Postmasters Café, a historic Arrowtown cottage replete with picket fence and Instagrammable gardens. **B D**

7 Queenstown - Lake Tekapo

Whether pinot noir grapes or cherries, things grow well in the fertile Central Otago region of the South Island. Get a taste for the area's plump stone fruit at the stall of a local orchard. Is it Michael Schumacher's Benetton F1 car or the \$4.2-million Aston Martin Vulcan that draws crowds to the Highlands Motorsport Museum? Discover some of the rarest cars in NZ motorsports history during your visit. Mountain drama is your backdrop en route to Lake Tekapo, with water so turquoise it looks

This part of the country is ravishing and remote; the lack of light pollution means dazzling Southern Hemisphere stargazing at UNESCO World Heritage listed Aoraki Mackenzie International Dark Sky Reserve.
